## State EPR monthly meeting





The monthly state DPH ERP meeting on Tuesday featured an update on the Medical Counter Measures program. Keith Goodman walked the group through the planning and operations of Points Of Distribution. Austin Spears presented The Knack, and talked about how best to capture data for reporting, even when preparedness matters are inherently not quantifiable. Additional updates were provided by leadership and finance. Jason Ellington told the group about plans being developed for the evacuation of Twin Towers during an emergency incident. Thanks to Venessa Sims for sending us pictures from the Georgia Resiliency Conference in Jekyll Island this week.







### Winter Weather Outlook

The Data Transmission Network (DTN) hosted its annual winter weather outlook on Wednesday. For Georgia, the season appears to be one with below average precipitation and average temperatures, although the second half of the winter could be slightly warmer than normal. Weather Risk Communicator Eric Jenks says there are many factors that go into these predictions including the anticipated weak La Nina this year, water temperatures in the oceans and great lakes, the polar vortex and the Siberian snow cover.





DTN presenters also did a recap of last winter, which in late January brought snow to much of Georgia with the higher snowfall totals falling further to the southern part of the state.
